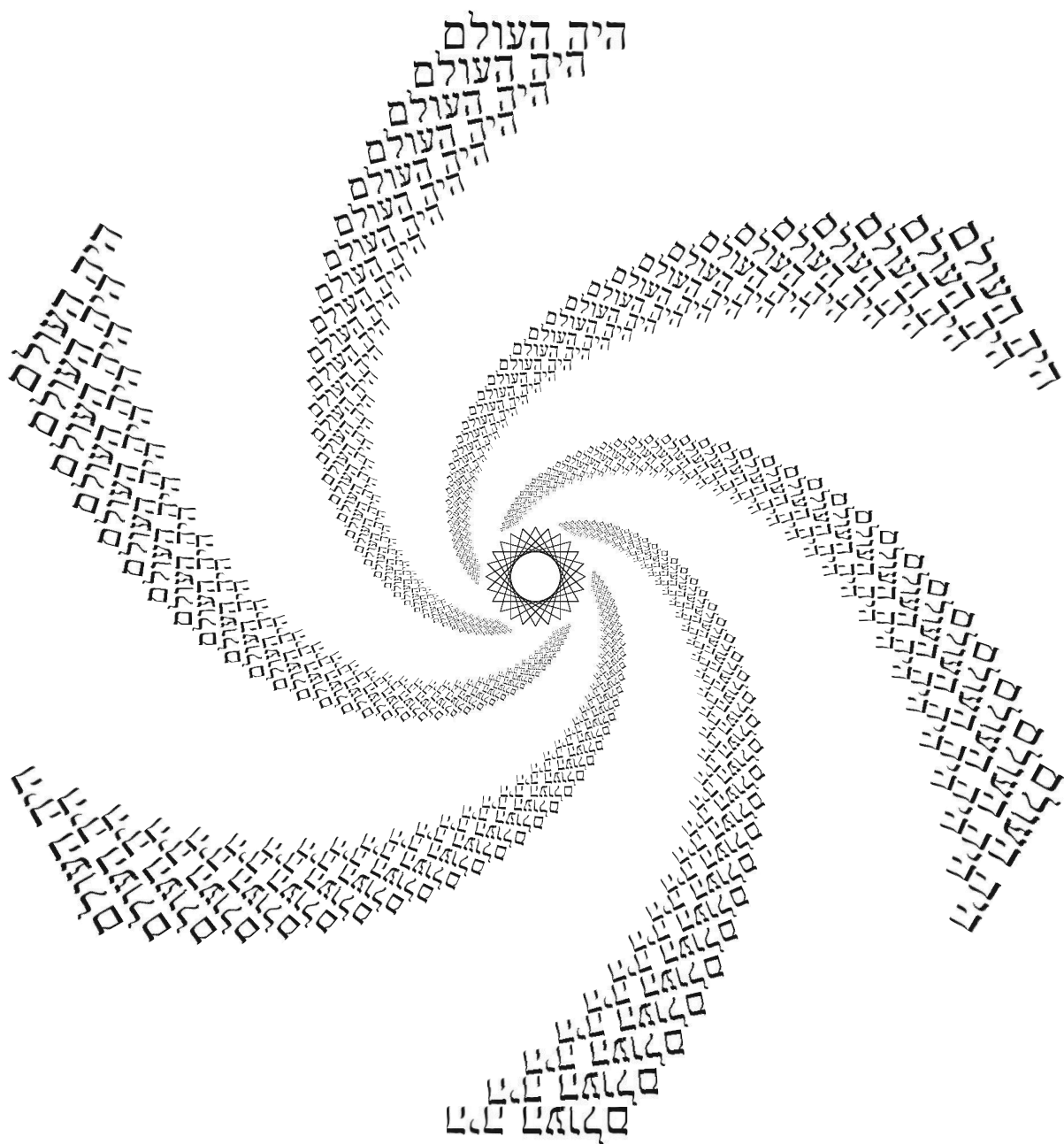


HaYaH ha'Olam



HaYaH is from the speculative super-protolanguage family Borean root verb HVJV = *to live*. The V's are unknown vowels. H is pronounced Hah and J is Yah. The first vowel is here sounded as a long "i" and the second to be like the "a" in about. Borean is posited as possibly existing anytime between 50,000 to 16,000BC. היה hayah is also a Hebrew Old Testament primitive root meaning *to exist*, that is, *be* or *become*, *come to pass*. (Always emphatic, and not a mere copula. In the HOT it is almost always in the past tense...but then it was *now* and *present*.) העולם ha'olam is biblical Hebrew and very broadly translated as 'the Universe'. But Strong's Dictionary says this of עולם olam: "properly *concealed*, that is, the *vanishing* point; generally time *out of mind* (past or future), that is, (practically) *eternity*; frequentative adverbially (especially with prepositional prefix) *always*: - always (-s), ancient (time), any more, continuance, eternal." So this statement/prayer/mantra sound pattern could mean variously, "become eternal", or "be beyond", or "exist hidden in no time".
